THEATRE: Anamika – A search for Krishna, 6th September at 6:00 pm & 8:00 pm




DOCUMENTARY: The Invisible (R)evolutions, 18th September at 7:00 pm


SPECIAL SCREENING: Un nuage sur le toit du Monde, 22nd September at 7:00 pm


LECTURE: André Malraux and India by Prof. Peter Tame, 24th September at 10:00 am




2009, Riad Sattouf, 1h30

EXHIBITION: Treasures from the Rainbow's End, 26th & 27th September all day


